Preparing for one's burial, service, and other arrangements

August 20, 2020

Create a folder or notebook that has the following information

- 1. Which church will hold the service? (some people have two churches they attend)
 - time and date are negotiated with the church first, then the funeral director.
- Is the burial itself at <u>that</u> church or another location? If another place, where? What documentation of purchase of a plot to you have?
 - Graveyard:
 - i. 10' x 10' plot is \$ 3,000.00* Casket Burial+ (restricted for two caskets)
 - ii. 5' x 2.5' plot \$ 1,000.00* Ash Burial (for two urns)
 - Memorial Garden: All plot \$ 600.00 Burial for two urns, including two bronze name plates.
 - Columbarium Niche 12"x12"x12" \$ 2,000.00 For interring one or two urns; does not include engraving of niche covering
- 3. Who will be the officiating clergy? (start with the rector, who can invite others)
- Choice of funeral director. (Some have made prearrangements and prepayments; provide documentation)
- 5. Choice of casket or cremation
- 6. Type of casket or urn (wooden or metal or biodegradable or will ashes be placed directly into the ground...or scattered.)
- 7. If casket, which clothes would you like to be buried in?
- 8. Tombstone wording or engraving (if permitted by the graveyard or cemetery)

- 9. List your favorite flowers (which might be used if in season)
- 10. Obituary: who would you like to write this? Or have you made one, or have some ideas? Have a conversation with family members (and/or the writer) about this.
 - family history, like parents' names
 - you might list schools, fraternal organizations, military history, employers
 - volunteering history, hobbies, favorite places, civic organizations, clubs and other memberships
 - designate the picture for your obituary and/or the church eblast
- 11. Charitable contributions: often people say, "In lieu of flowers, the family request

contributions to be made to _____."

- so consider your church(es), like Good Shepherd or one of our endowment funds
- other charities or organizations
- you can designate 1-3 (or more) recipients; provide addresses or websites
- 12. Details of the service (outlined in the COGS guide as well)
 - lessons (2 or 3; Old Testament, New Testament, Gospel, Psalm)
 - Rite I or Rite II?
 - select readers for the lessons; clergy read the gospel
 - speakers
 - musical selections, including any special things, like bagpipes or flute or soloist
 - Communion or no communion?
 - ushers?
 - pall bearers and honorary pall bearers?
 - any special details?
 - any military honors?
- 13. Reception to follow. (List your wishes.)
- 14. Any special people to contact about the service? Provide their information
- 15. Other Documents from Good Shepherd
 - Memorial Service Guide
 - Guidelines for Graveyard, Memorial Garden, and Columbarium
